A Mission Of One Accord Ministry

The **Mission** for Of One Accord Ministry is to bring a cooperative community effort to identify and meet local needs with the Love of Jesus Christ.

*Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me.
Matt 25:40*

Hancock County is the lowest income county in East TN and the 27th lowest income county in our nation. Average income of the families we serve is \$6-\$12,000 per year.

We are still finding families who don't have bathrooms and some don't have indoor water. Snuffy Smith shacks have in some cases been replaced by old used mobile homes that are cold and costly to heat in the winter or hot without air conditioning in the summer.

This was predominantly small farms 50 years ago. Few farm people in our communities made much and now many are retired with minimum Social Security income of about \$600 a month for their homes. You can't eat and repair your car, or eat and fix your house or eat and purchase medicine on this income.

What is Of One Accord Ministry?

Of One Accord Ministry was founded in 1988 to develop a cooperate effort of the local church community and it's initial primary program was to distribute emergency food. Today Of One Accord serves two rural East TN Appalachian Counties through four ministry sites in three towns.

Some 350 volunteers serve 80,000 people each year in a variety of programs. OOA operates three food pantries, two thrift stores and a free medical clinic. From these locations, we do programs like emergency food distribution, Neighborly Meals (a meals on wheels delivery for the elderly), USDA Summer Feeding for youth, county wide Christmas program for Hawkins County, free winter coat and outer wear distribution, a free medical clinic and Operation Good Neighbor, which works with mission teams to do home repairs, VBS, Block Parties and other mission activities.

How is the Home Repair Program Funded?

The Home Repair Program does not have a source of funding from within Of One Accord. All funds used for home repairs have come from grants (some of which can be complicated and all have low caps) or resources brought by mission teams.

The Home Repair Program has operated in the red since it's beginning. Unfinished repairs and problems with repairs have needed professional touch-ups after teams leave. Some grants didn't come through or didn't cover all expenses. Some government grants require federal inspectors to make site visits requiring punch-lists to be corrected before grant payments to be made. All these uncertainties have kept our organization struggling not to endanger other programs due to bills we can't pay.

How Do We Obtain and Process Applications?

Applications come a variety of ways. The primary way is an advertisement in the paper followed by a town hall meeting to explain to possible clients how the process works, what to expect, and we help them fill out their applications. Referrals are taken from churches and other groups within our county. On our visit to the family, we look for projects. When you visit, the house might need work from one end to the other, but we try to help the homeowner prioritize their needs and think in terms of projects mission teams can do.

**We are asking teams to provide the following financial partnership:
FEES**

The Best Sizes for Groups are 35 or less

- **Each team is responsible to bring \$100.00 per team member**
- **\$35.00 for children under 12**
- **Some teams ask to simply do a VBS and Block Party at a single location. We ask \$35.00 per team member for these teams that take less supervision and interaction.**
- **Each team requiring use of the shower trailer will be responsible to bring a \$50 fee which will go toward maintenance and gas for the unit.**
- **Fee due dates: 50% of the “expected” fee is needed 30 days prior to your arrival date and the remaining 50% is needed upon arrival.**
- **Checks should be made to Of One Accord Ministry and the memo line should say Mission Fees**
- **Insurance is required by each church for each mission team member and “if” there are big instances or small, home churches need to be responsible.**
- **Please schedule a week for your group through Of One Accord Ministry Mission Coordinator**

- We continually try to think out of the box so if you have an idea please let us know so that we can help your ideas become reality.

Partnering Efforts:

- The Mission Coordinator (Jennifer Kinsler) will assist you in locating a place to stay while here (if needed), help with setting up your projects, continuous connection with your leader, and assuring your mission trip is a success.
- A summer staff person will be assigned to your team to provide :
 1. help locating area businesses (lumber yards, convenience centers for trash etc.)
 2. onsite visits throughout day to see if needs arise that require assistance
 3. help ensure materials are on the site (each team should have designated runners)
 4. If you have concerns address them immediately to your site supervisor
- We will send preliminary photos to your home repair leader based on your skill sets. to help you choose your projects.
- We will send information about possible locations for Back-yard Bible Clubs or Block Parties to let you begin to think through what you can do and how you can use member's gifts to serve.

Preparing for Your Trip:

- Set a date for your trip
- Make accommodations (**Best to make in advance since we have a lot of teams coming in**)
- Discuss projects
- Plan for a pilot trip to narrow home choices to the one you want to work on.
- On the pilot trip, do a preliminary materials list, get measurements, etc. to begin to get an idea of what the project might cost and what materials will be needed.

- **Types of work you might expect to find:**

wheel chair ramps	replacing floors
porches or decks	cleaning gutters
siding	roof work
painting	landscaping/ yard clean-up

- **It is the responsibility of each team to have a knowledgeable site leader. Even though Of One Accord hopes to assign someone to your team, these staff persons might not have any experience in home repairs.**
- **It is the responsibility of your mission's team leader to work with our Mission Team Director to insure the work site is ready for you. In most cases a Port-a-let will be at each site. In some cases we have to plan ahead to rent large dumpsters, scaffolding or other items you need.**

Planning with Your Team:

- Schedule a meeting of the mission team to brief everyone on the type of work that will be preformed, various assignments that can be made and personal equipment needed. Your work site can run smoothly “if” everything is well planned out and covered before the actual work begins. The following suggestions will help to have a positive experience for all involved.
 1. Type of work to be accomplished
 2. Make assignments and leadership roles (**You will need to have a runner to get materials**)
 3. Go over tools/equipment needed on job site
 4. Go over essentials of what is expected at the job site as far as respect for the home owner, their property and the neighborhood and what is expected as far as behavior and appropriate and modest dress.
 5. Emphasize safety on the job site (**VERY IMPORTANT**)
 6. Prayer Walk the community beforehand & pray together at the start of each day
 7. Have someone lead a morning devotion or a lunch devotion each day
 8. Don't forget to plan for drinks (plenty of water) and possibly lunch while on site. Enlist those who will be working your meals.
 9. Purchase and gather up all necessary materials, supplies and equipment that your team members cannot supply.

Made the Trip- Preparing for Work (Sunday)

There should be Of One Accord staff meet you upon arrival. You have made a long trip and need to refresh and eat. At some point, you will want to revisit the job site, get a final materials list and work with the Mission Team Director to have materials at the job site as early as possible.

On the Job Site:

Put into practice what you've prepared for, with everyone working together and filling the various roles to accomplish the repair work. ***Your key words to remember for the week:***

Be Flexible Be Flexible Be Flexible

Most lumber companies open at 7:30 am. Depending on how your materials are to be delivered, it might be from 9 am-10 am before they are on the job site. Have team members preparing for materials, like take off old roof, taking up old floor, cleaning around base of house before siding can go on, etc.

At the end of each day, make sure to clean up and when job is completed. Next week staff will be with other teams, instead of cleaning the site for families. It is the responsibility of the team to take trash and debris away from the job site.

During your time on the job site, take time to talk with and discover ways you can encourage and minister to the family. Invite the family to join you for lunch and for your devotion time. Pray for God to give you opportunities to witness to the family and to those you come in contact with on the job site and surrounding neighborhood.

Pilot Groups are Needed to Help choose locations of lodging, eating, and activities

Hawkins County:

Home Repairs:

Home Repair projects are available for the skill set of each church. They can be as simple as painting or building ramps to complex.

Homes are chosen between Jan and March. During that time we try to find funding sources. Then homes are released for teams to choose the home they want to work on. Jennifer Kinsler will work with each team to choose a home best for them.

VBS– block parties:

There are several sites where we have done successful VBS's. The best attendance is when a VBS is coupled with a block party on the last night and drawings are held for prizes.

We find the best time for these activities are right at 5-6pm. We are encouraging local churches to team up with teams to help advertise and host these events for greater success.

Distributions:

Distributions are successful- Some teams distribute hygiene items, back packs, or other items.

Sport Camps

We have only recently had teams begin to do Sport Camps. We are learning to be successful. These can be done in various areas with pre-approval.

Prayer Walking

Of One Accord Ministry was built on prayer and we firmly believe in prayer. Our area is among the highest meth and prescription drug abuse areas of the nation. There is an unusually high rate of family violence, family sexual abuse also. While this is the center of the Bible Belt, it suffers a higher rate of issues mentioned above as well as Appalachian mindsets that breed isolation and poverty. We know prayer can break these cycles and allow God to set the captives free.

Acts of Kindness day:

Making one day an act of kindness day with multiple ways to demonstrate the love of God through car washes, distributions of small things, and other ways of service

Serving at the Nursing Home or Boys and Girls Club:

While these are not day long activities, there are 3 nursing homes, 1 assisted living, and 1 Boys and Girls Club in Hawkins County and Hancock County (combined)

If you feel comfortable with the area you may wish to send out groups for visitation with the senior clients.

Lunch Box This is our summer feeding program for the children in the area.

We have 2 locations one in Rogersville and one in Church Hill.

8 -11am 50-100 food sacks are prepared - **2-4 people**

11am -2 pm food is delivered- **2-4 people** can go and assist the bus driver with this. The bus goes to local housing projects and mobile home parks.

Parking Lot Activities— for evangelism

Develop a parking lot activity one or more nights during the week after-hours to draw young people and offer an evangelist appeal of some type.
